### Generosity

Reflecting on the symbol of a wheel.

This half term we will be thinking about Generosity reflecting on the symbol of a wheel. Generosity means giving to others – not reluctantly, or just a little bit, but freely and happily. It's one thing to know what the word means, and another thing to be able to make a habit of it! We are also thinking of Holy Week, the seven days leading up to Easter. It includes Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. On Easter Sunday the church celebrates the Resurrection of Jesus Christ after his Crucifixion.
