

## **IMPACT OF SPORTS FUNDING 2016 - 2017**

### **Evidencing the Impact of Primary PE and Sport Premium**

The funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following OBJECTIVE;

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. It is to emphasise that the focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium, funding.

It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 indicators;

1. the engagement of ALL pupils in regular physical activity - kick starting healthy active lifestyles
2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. increased participation in competitive sport

School is using the funding to employ specialist coaches, who are deployed alongside teachers rather than displacing them, in order for their impact to be sustainable and to enable the up skilling of existing teachers.

## REFLECTION; WHAT HAVE WE ACHIEVED?

Our pupils demonstrate a greater skill set, enthusiasm and enjoyment for Sports and PE across the school.

Throughout the academic year, children have had various opportunities to showcase their sporting abilities across a range of events against other children from other schools. Some of these competitions include: - cross country, football, netball, and hockey. Money was expended on purchasing team strips with the aim of developing better team spirit and raising moral. Money was also expended on supply and transport to enable the pupils to attend the competition. Overall the school's participation in inter-school events was greatly increased. Increase leadership opportunities for Year 5/6	The development of the role of the Sports Leader in school is helping us to promote a healthy lifestyle with children from an early age and providing our pupils with a wider variety of sporting and healthy lifestyle experiences for them to benefit from before, during and after school. This has increased participation in a number of sports. The impact of the sports funding is evident in the positive feedback received by the pupils and staff. The impact can also be seen by the amount of children participating in lunchtime clubs and activities and as well as the successful participation in local festivals and sporting competitions. By using playground leaders and continuing with our coaches, these improvements are proving to be sustainable because of the motivation and enthusiasm of all parties involved. The leadership programme has enabled those pupils to feel a sense of achievement and enjoyment and strengthened their self-esteem.
